COLTEN'S CORNER Why are there processions in the Mass like the entrance procession, the gospel procession, the offertory procession, and the exit procession?

First, we have to remember that as Christians we are very *sacramental* and *symbolic* people. We inherit this from our Jewish background. The Mass is full of signs, symbols, gestures, movements, etc. The Catechism speaks to this: "A *sacramental celebration is woven from signs and symbols*. In keeping with the divine pedagogy of salvation, their meaning is rooted in the work of creation and in human culture, specified by the events of the Old Covenant and fully revealed in the person and work of Christ" (CCC 1145). It continues by saying this about signs particularly signs within the sacraments: "Since Pentecost, it is through the *sacramental signs* of his Church that the Holy Spirit carries on the work of sanctification. Further, they fulfill the types and figures of the Old Covenant, *signify and make actively present* the salvation wrought by Christ, and prefigure and anticipate the glory of heaven" (CCC 1152).

The processions are movements that act as signs to us. They are to remind us that we are a "pilgrim people." Think back to when the Israelite people had to travel in the desert 40 years before they entered the promise land. Their destiny and real homeland was the land, promised by God, that they hadn't yet reached. They were pilgrims. In the same way, because of the Passion, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Christ, our destiny and real home is not on this earth. We are pilgrims on this earth. Although we live on this earth, our citizenship is truly in heaven (cf. Phil. 3:20)! We do not live for this world but for the next! Just like the people were fed in the desert with the Manna (the miraculous bread that God sent) on their way to the promise land, we too are fed, nourished, and strengthened with the Miraculous Bread that is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Our Lord Jesus Christ as we travel through this life on our way to the heavenly promise land!
